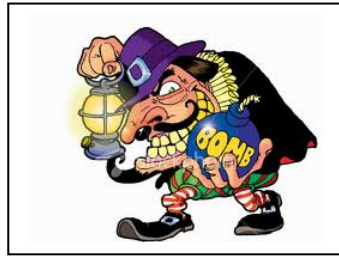


THE STORY OF GUY FAWKES

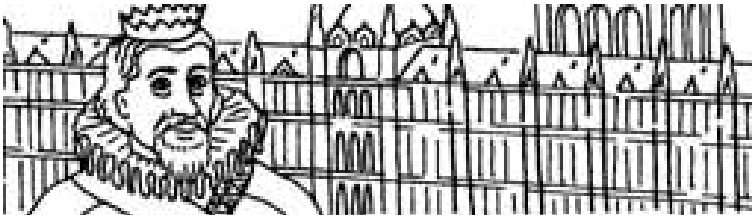

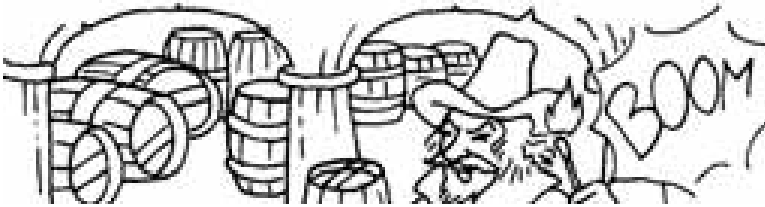
